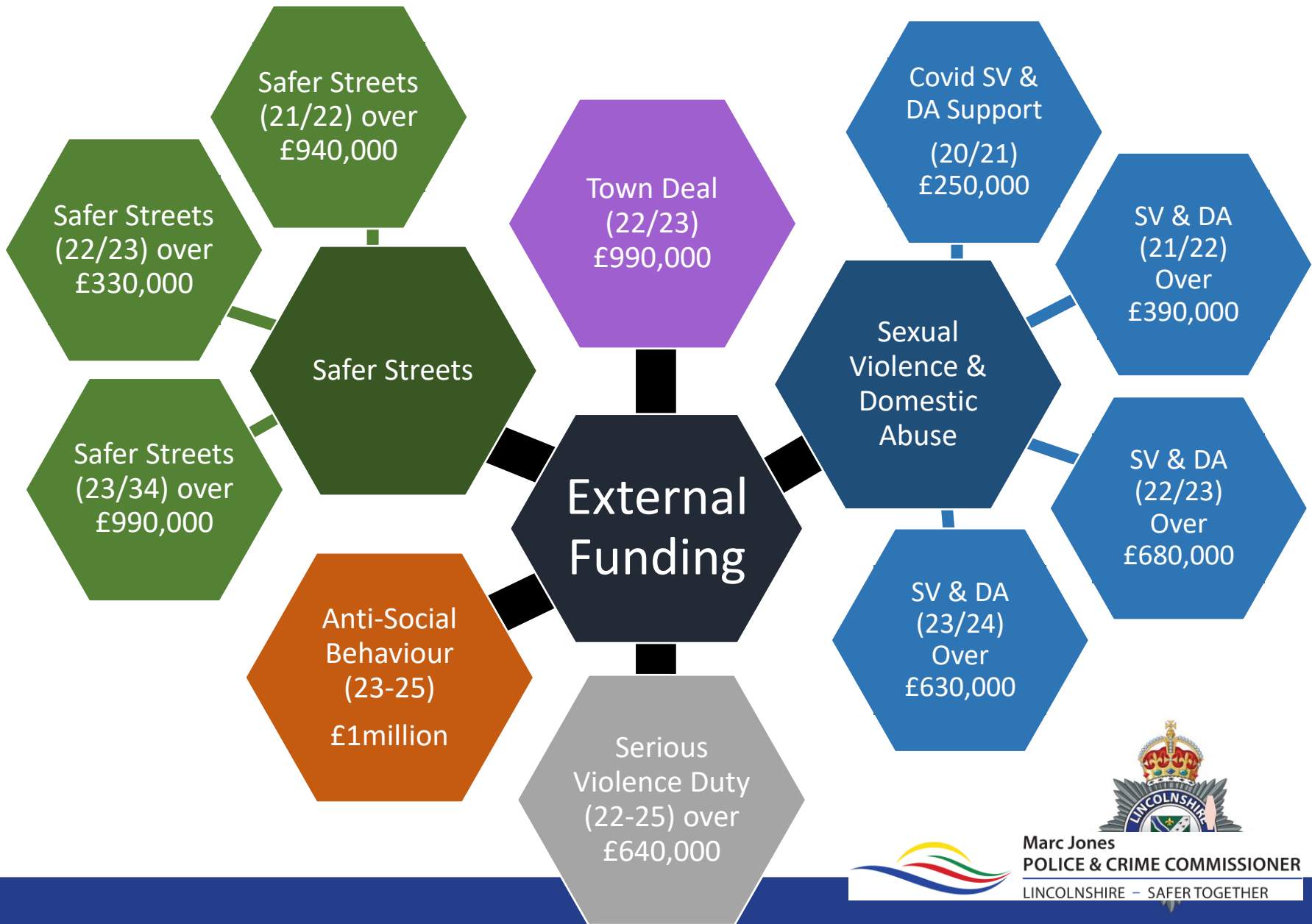

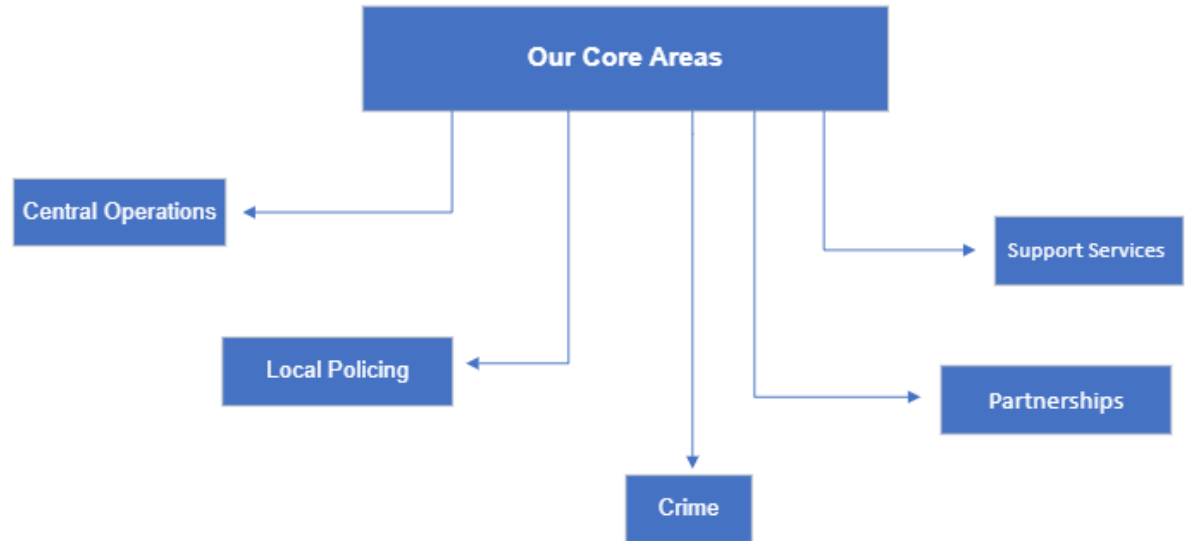

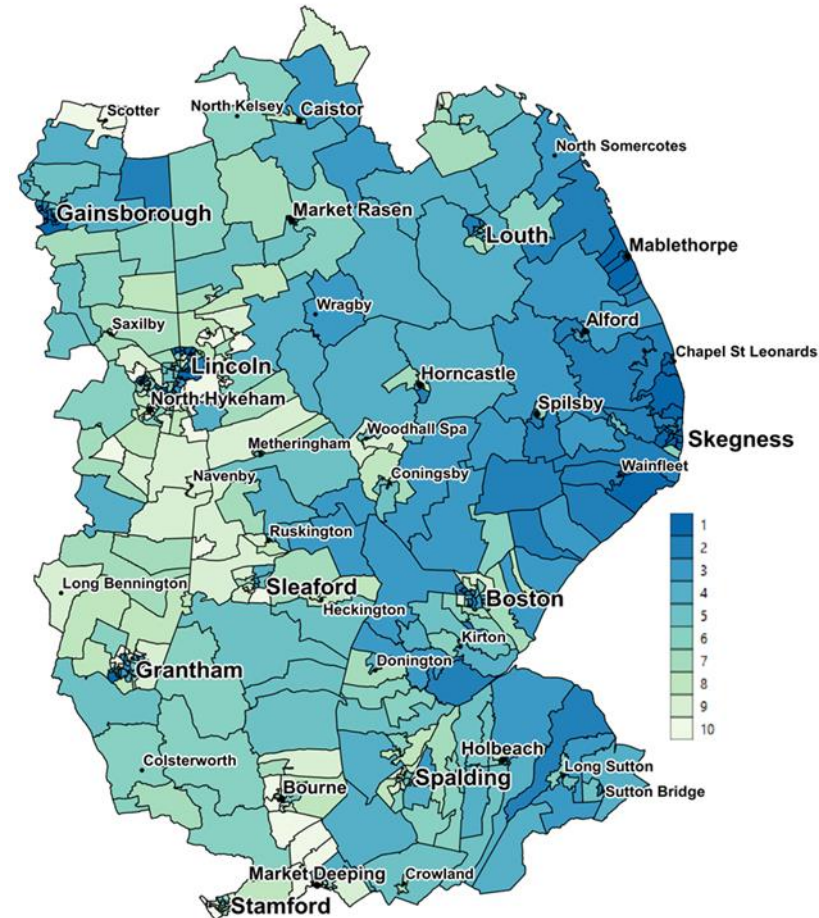

Deprivation in Lincolnshire

- The areas of highest deprivation in Lincolnshire can be found in pockets of the major towns and along the coast
- The most deprived area in Lincolnshire can be found in **Gainsborough South West**. It is the 24th most deprived neighbourhood out of 32,844 LSOAs in England
- The second and third most deprived areas in the county can be found in **Skegness** and **Chapel St Leonards**

A TYPICAL DAY IN THE LIFE OF LINCOLNSHIRE POLICE



The population of Lincolnshire is approximately **768,400**.

On a typical day there are on average **531** police officers on duty

INCOMING DEMAND

We typically record **441 Incidents** per day.

We typically deal with **157 crimes** per day. 36% of all incidents we record

ONGOING DEMAND

In addition to reacting to calls for service from the public, on atypical day the police will also be undertaking proactive work to safeguard the public including:

Officers will deal with **31 incidents of ASB**.

Deal with at least **21 incidents** involving issues of **Mental Health**.

Deal with **7 reports of Missing People**.

Attend **19 Road Traffic Collisions**.

Deal with **49 Concern for Safety Incidents**.

We continue to manage **26 Organised Crime Groups**.

We continue to manage **19 County Lines**.

This year we managed **1109 Domestic Abuse cases** with MARAC partners

We manage **1227 Registered Sex Offenders** in partnership with other local agencies

Officers will make **30 arrests** per day.

Officers will deal with:

- 9 Burglaries
- 43 Violent Crimes
- 20 Stalking & Harassments
- 7 Sexual Offences
- 31 Thefts
- 15 Criminal Damages
- 6 Vehicle Offences

Officers will carry out **9 Stop Searches** a day, of which one will result in an arrest.

Attend **34 Domestic Incidents**.

Neighbourhood Policing Focus

Engagement – We will be informative, have two-way conversations and be active in our communities including with partner organisations

Prevention – We will use structured problem-solving techniques to address local priorities and to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour, working collaboratively with communities and partners

Targeting – We will ensure neighbourhood policing team's activity is in the right areas to provide greater focus to community engagement, problem solving, crime prevention and early intervention

The Statistical Process Charts (SPC) are graphs used to study how a process changes over time. The main aims of using SPC charts are to understand what is 'different' and what is 'normal'.

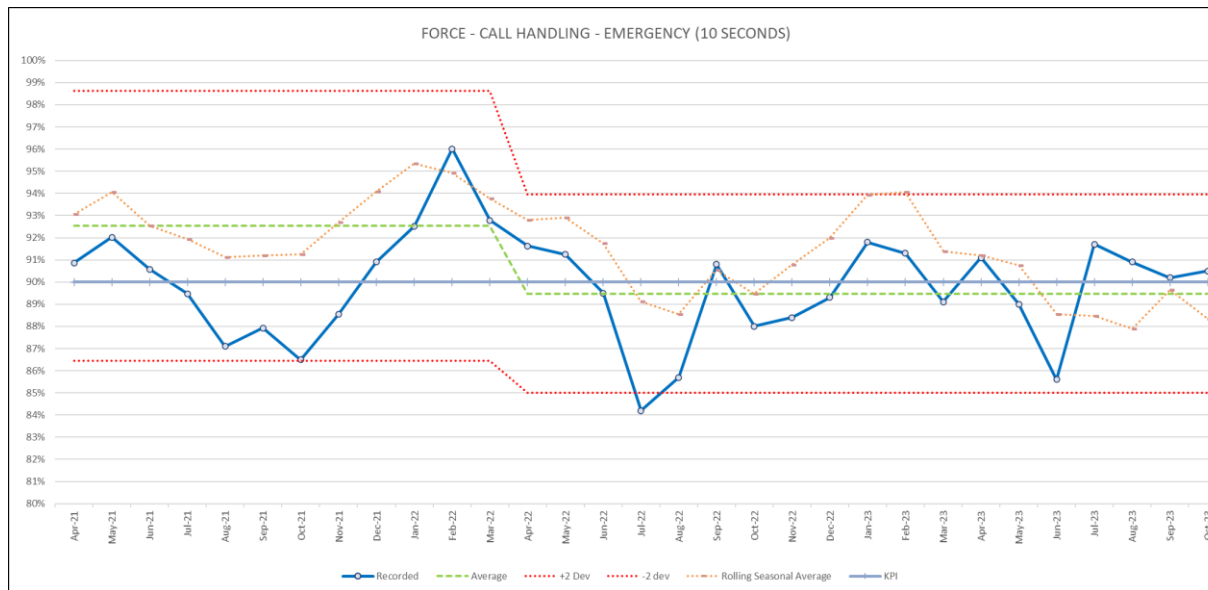
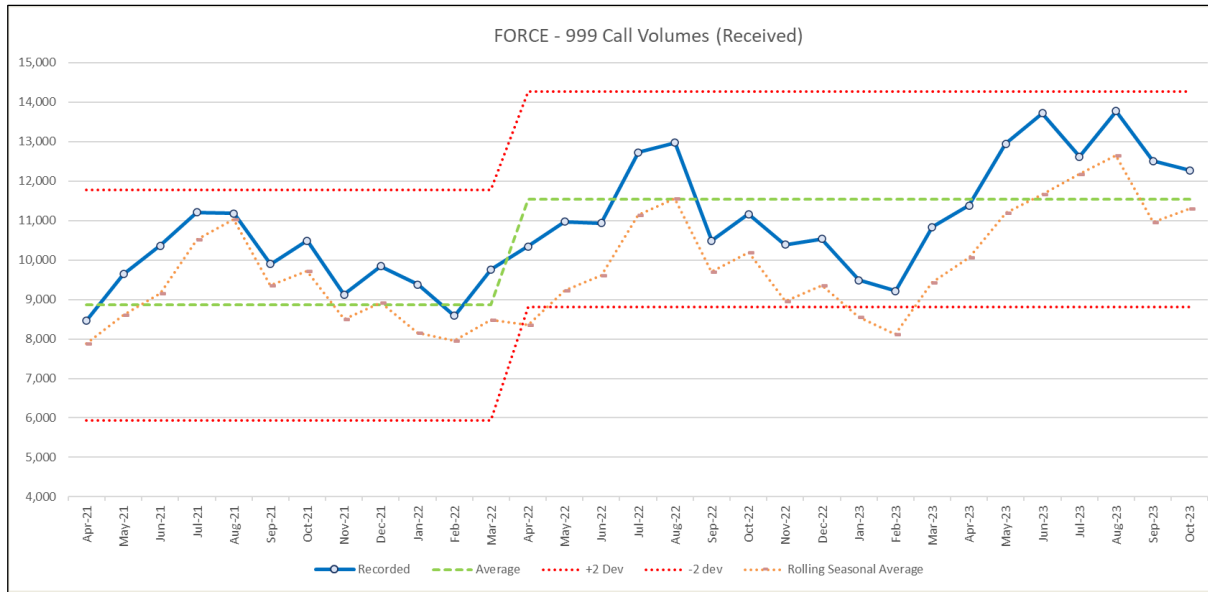
SPC charts require a minimum of 10 data points in order to create a valid chart, although there is increased reliability when using 20 or more data points. Data should also be plotted chronologically in date or process order, usually shown as distinct data points. The following are then calculated:

- 1) Average (mean) based on the previous rolling 36 months to end of the current / most recent reporting month. Any data sets that do not have a full 36 months, use the entire available data set, until a full 3 years are available.
- 2) Standard Deviations used to determine how far a value is from the mean. The SPC charts are set to two standard deviations.
- 3) Seasonal averages are based on the same month for the last 3 years, including the most recent year. For example, the seasonal average for October 2023 is calculated from the average of October 2021 , October 2022 and October 2023.

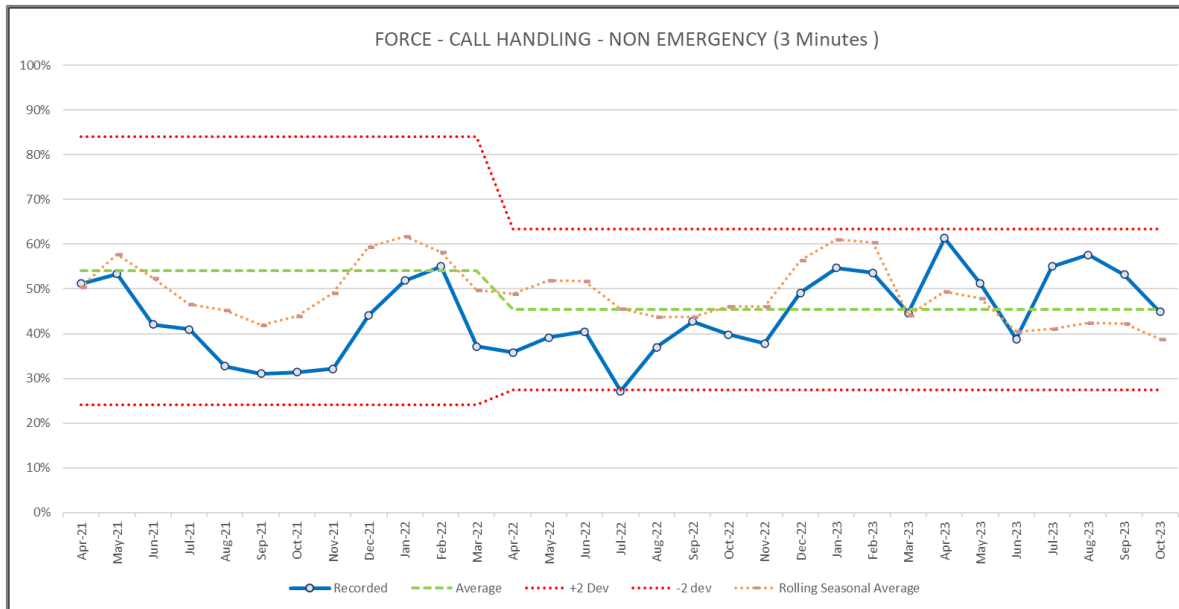
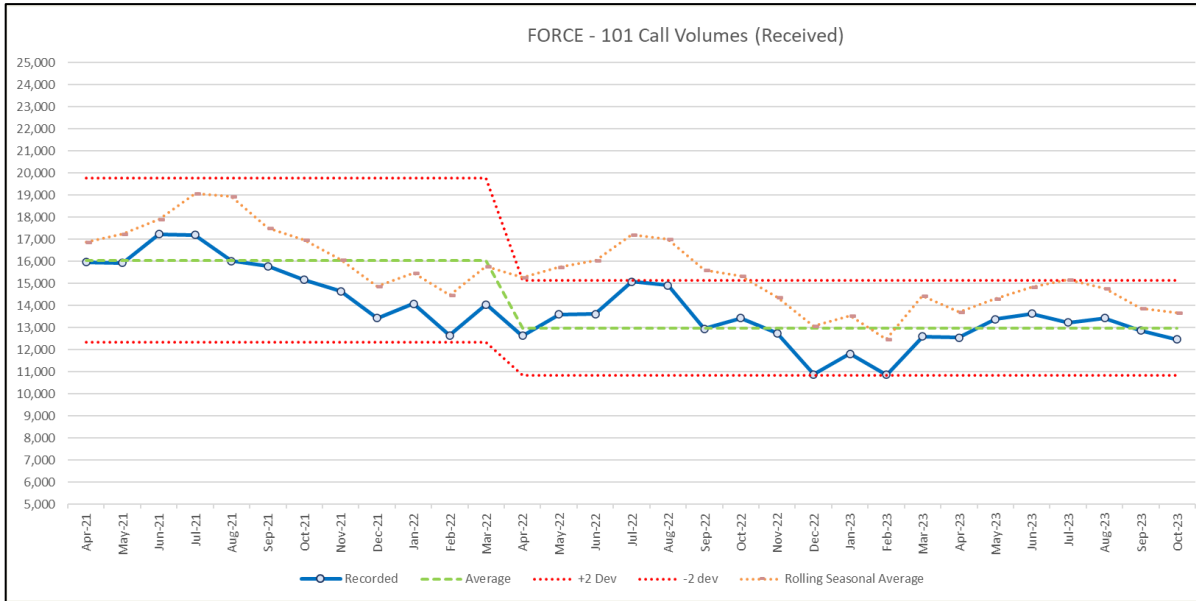
Note the tolerance levels have been re-set as the level of offending has returned to pre-covid levels



Force Call Handling - 999

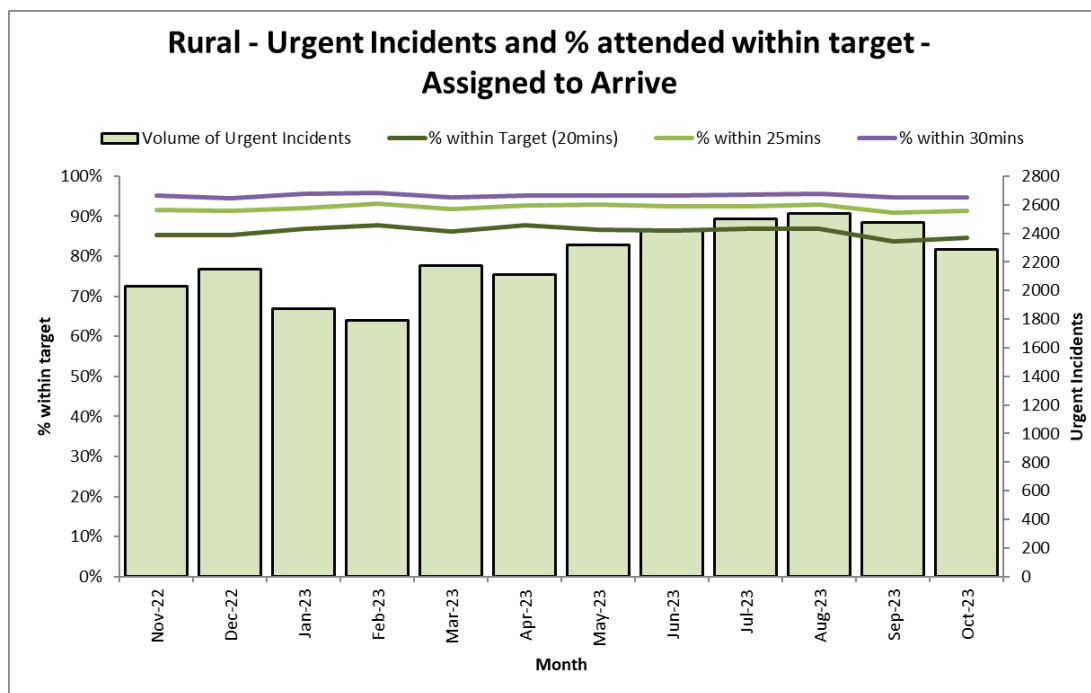


Force Call Handling - 101

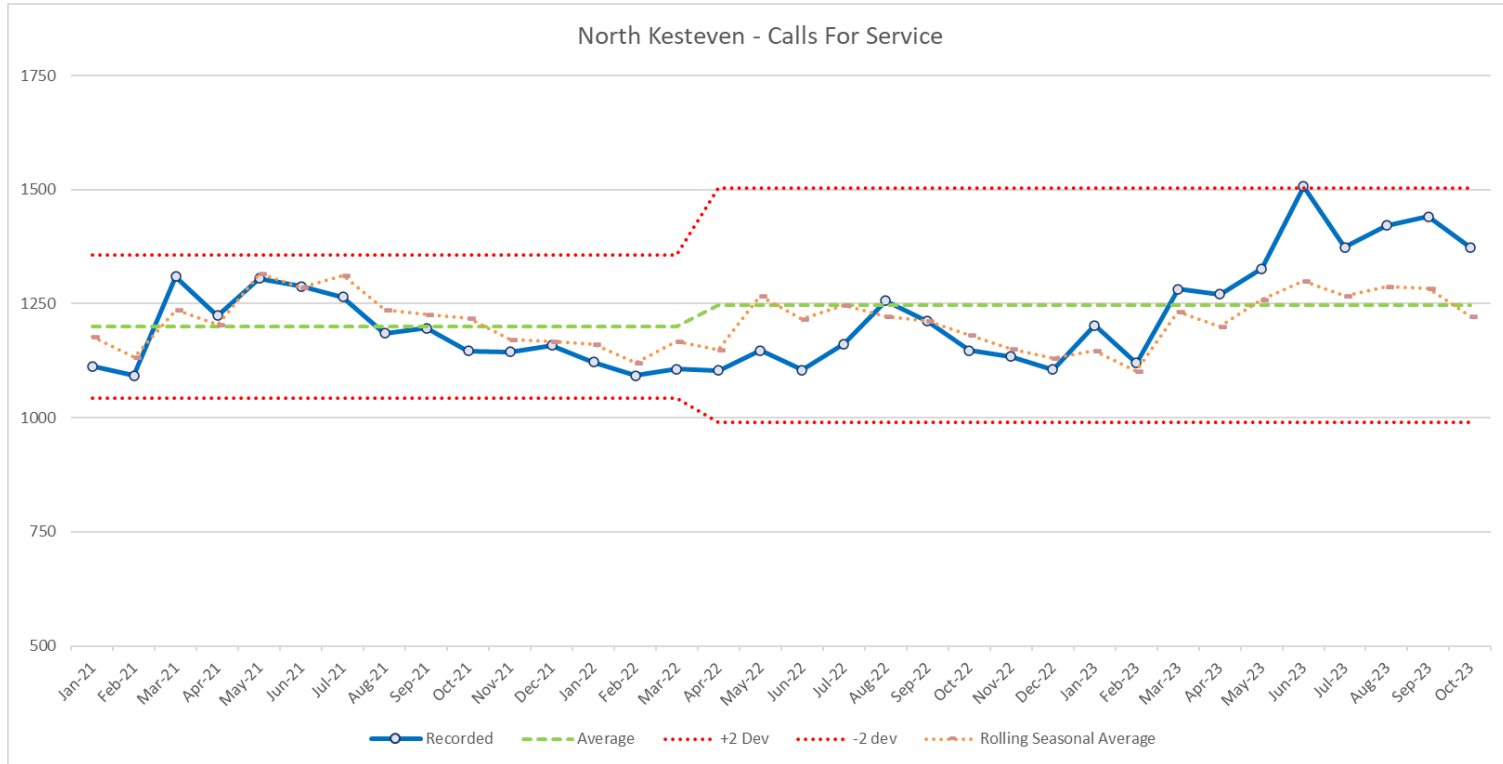

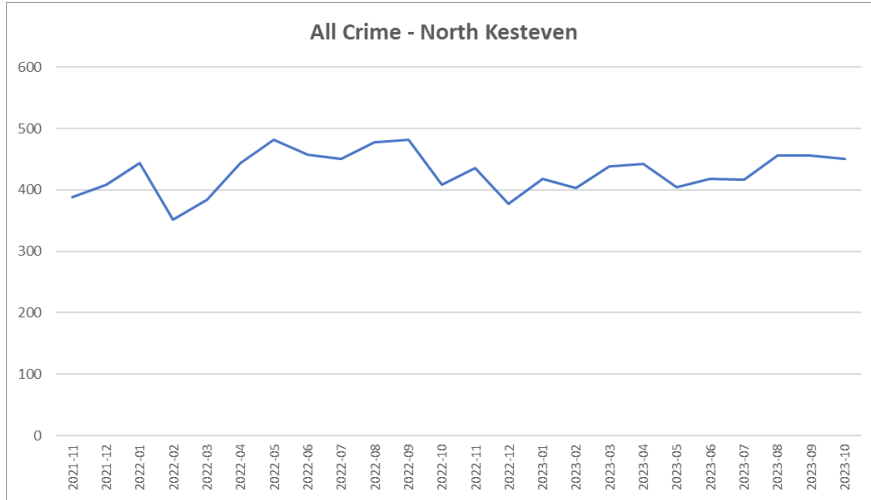
Calls for Service – North Kesteven

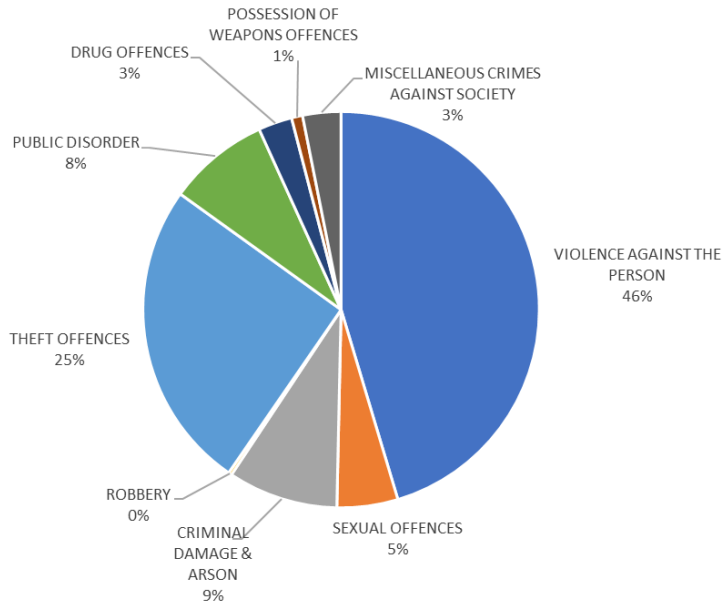

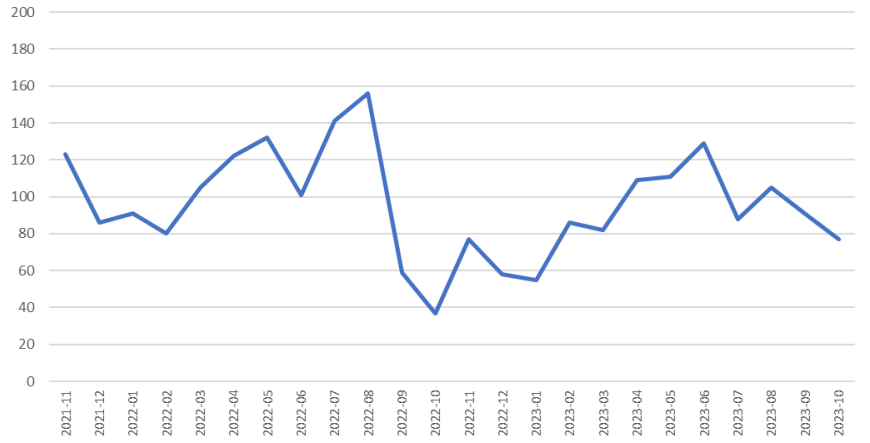

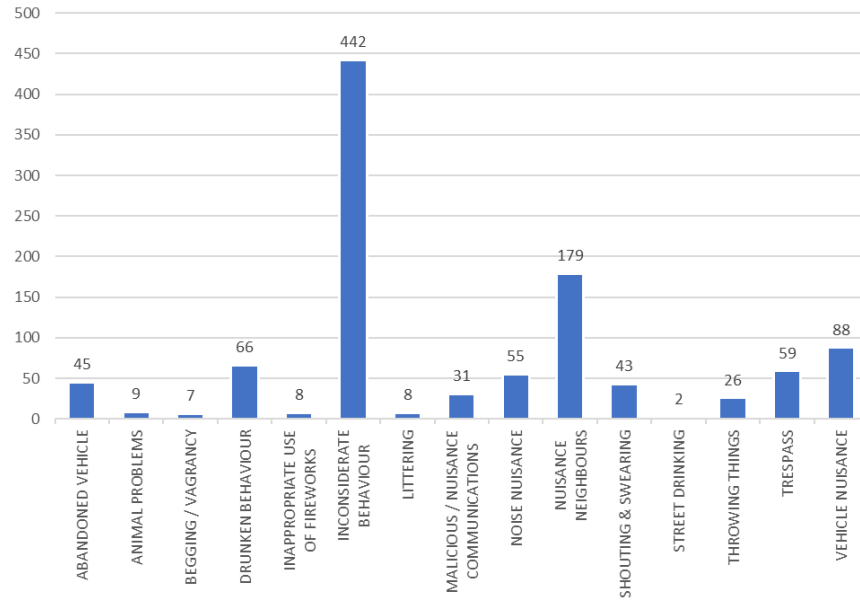

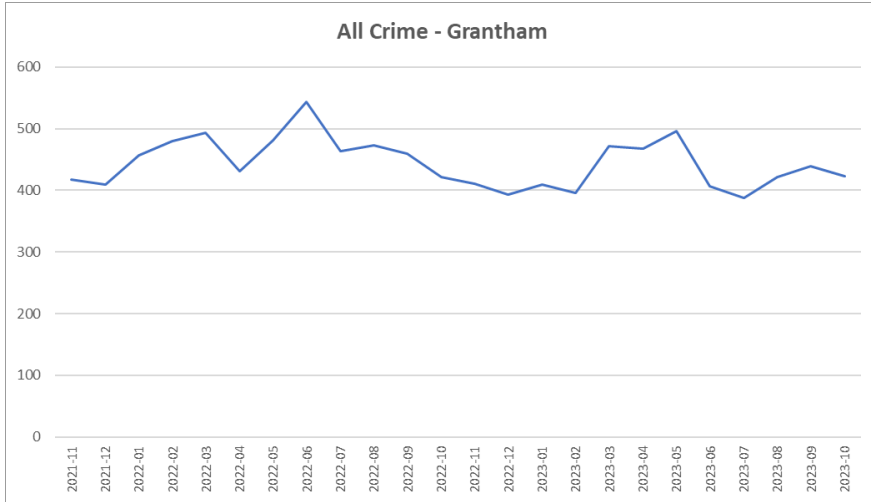

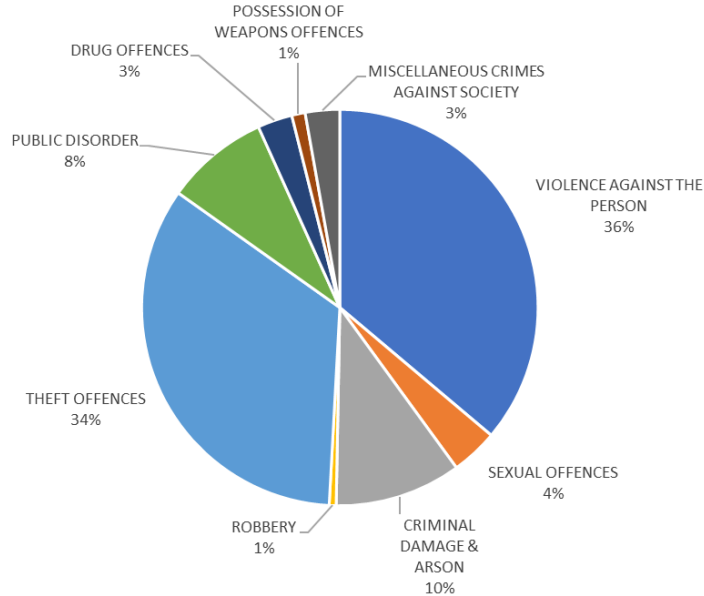

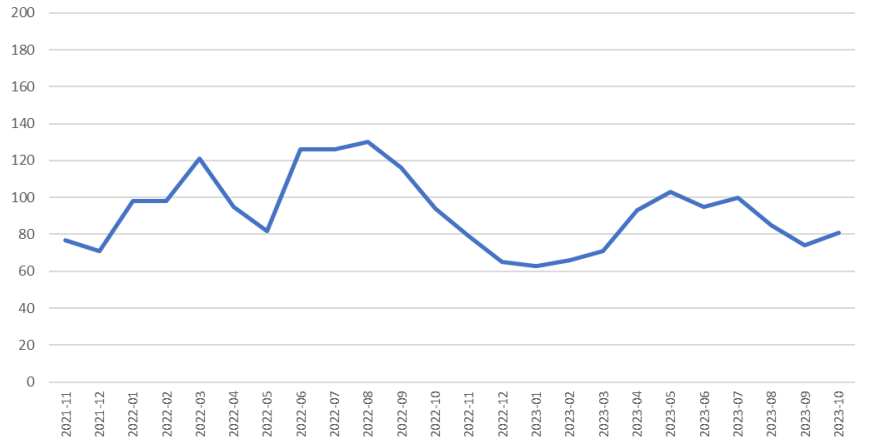

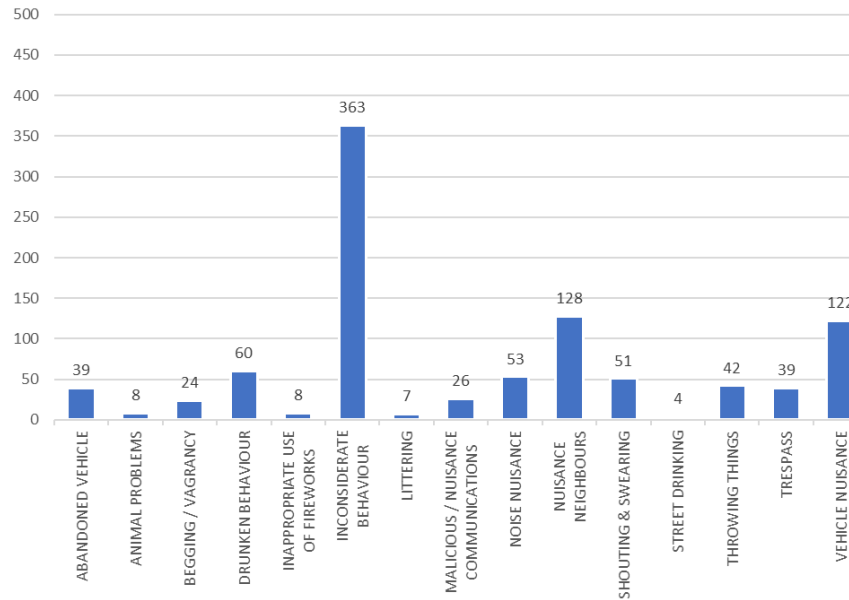

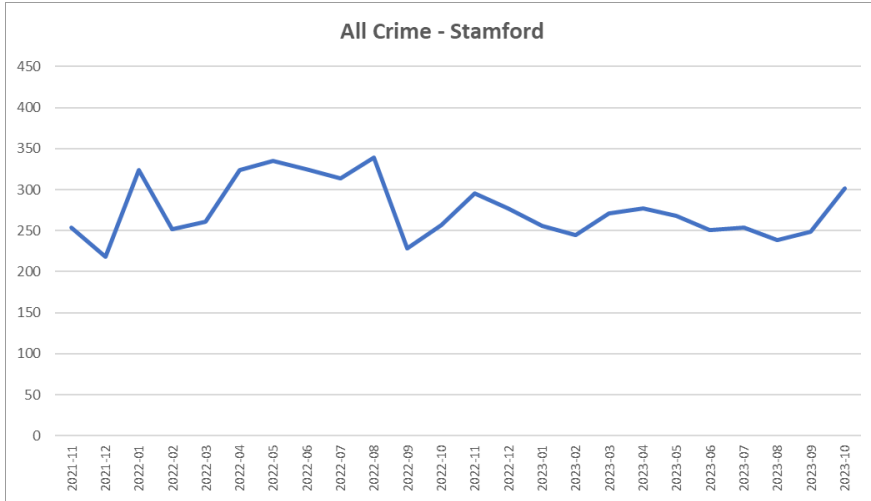

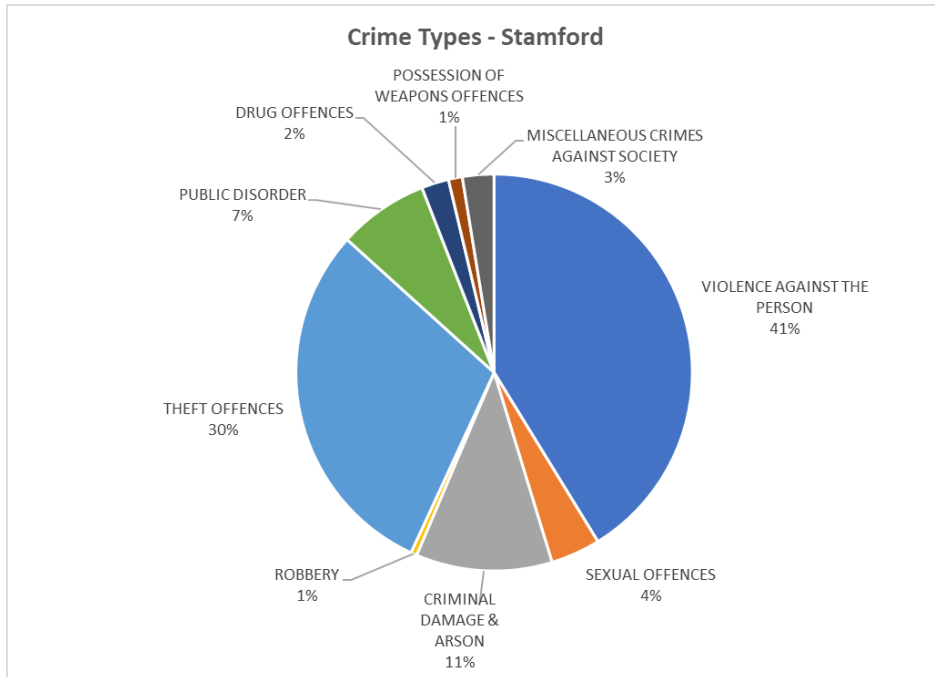

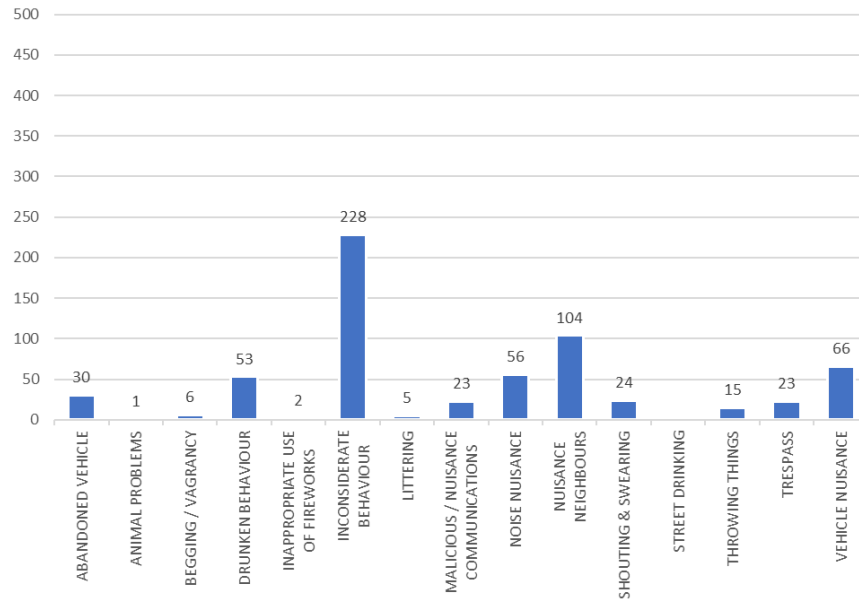

Work of your Neighbourhood Policing Team



Speeding

- RPU and ARVs target identified collision hotspots with speed as a contributing factor.
- Identified as one of the Fatal 5 so priority for all Officers to enforce when available to do so.
- Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership carry out speed enforcement at identified sites in line with Department of Transport Guidance
- Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership can be contacted to consider a site for Speed Enforcement
- Community Speed Watch
- Work with Highways to engineer out collisions caused by Speed



Parking

- Parking is now a civil offence so no longer enforced by Police responsibility for this is the County Council
- Police will only be involved if vehicle position is causing an immediate danger to other Road Users.
- If vehicles are parking illegally can report to County Council parking enforcement team
- If communities want parking restrictions on Roads the County Council are the authority to contact

Drug Supply and Associated Criminality

A dedicated, multi skilled response to drug related criminal activity

Engagement with partner agencies, businesses and residents

Plain clothed, proactive, patrols

A significant increase in intelligence submitted and processed

7 Magistrates Warrants obtained and executed

16 arrests with investigations on-going

3 x closure orders obtained to protect vulnerable residents



Stamford, Bourne and The Deepings:

County Lines Drug Supply

CL is the supply of drugs through organised crime networks using a dedicated “deal line”, involves the exploitation of vulnerable persons including children

Activity aimed at disruption and identifying safeguarding opportunities

Cross border intelligence sharing with Cambridgeshire and Leicestershire Police

Targeted stop checks of identified “delivery vehicles”

8 persons currently arrested with investigations on-going
